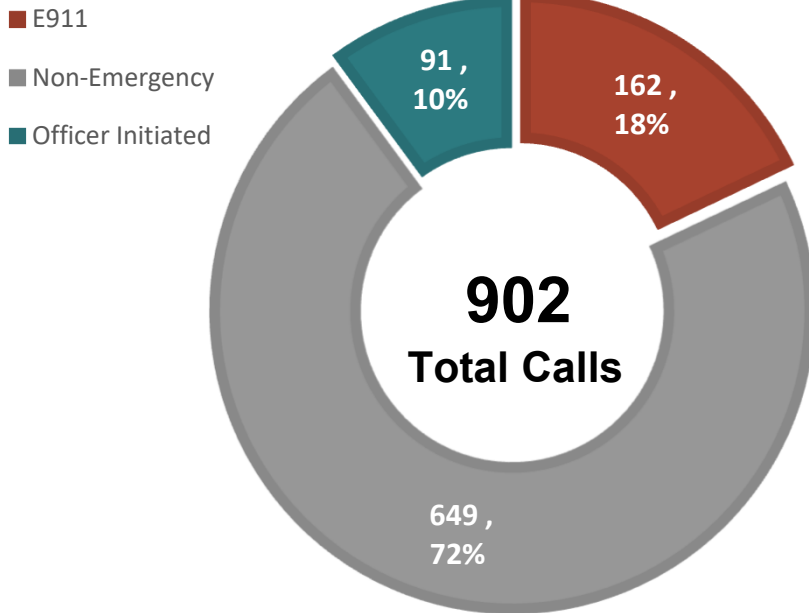
A QUICK NOTE ABOUT THIS DATA...

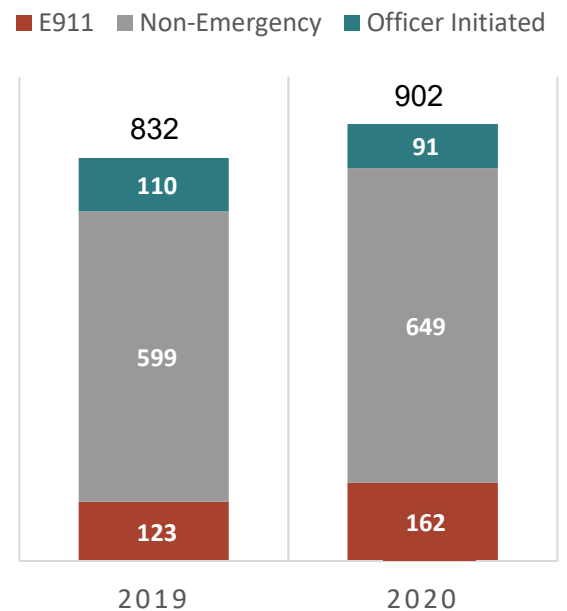

Lastly, "YTD" means year-to-date through the date listed above. "PYTD" means previous year-to-date though the date listed above.

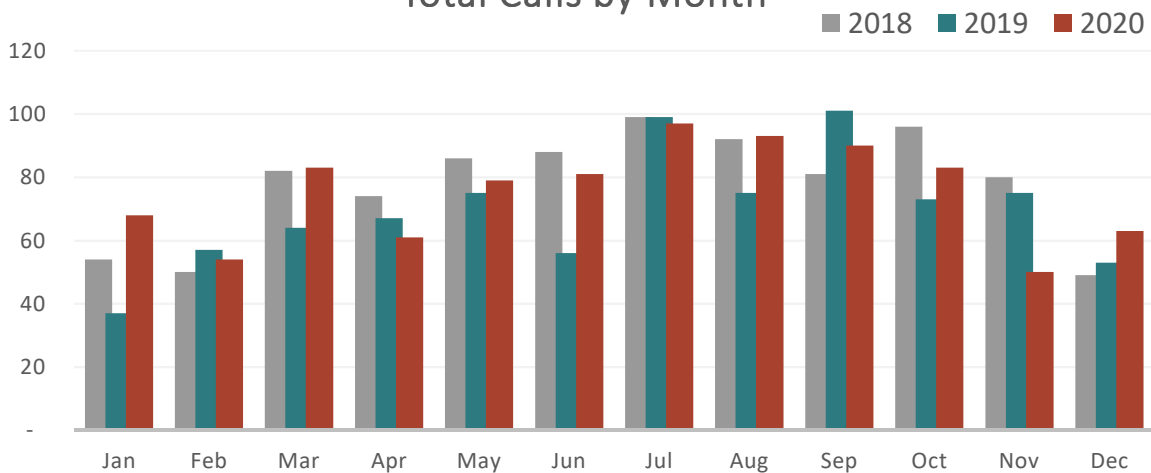
2020 CALLS FOR SERVICE YTD BY SOURCE

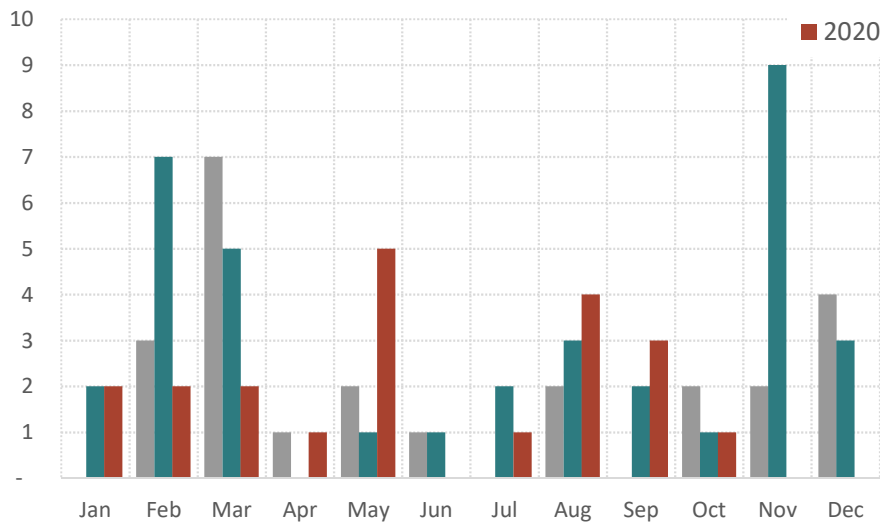

BY MONTH AND YEAR

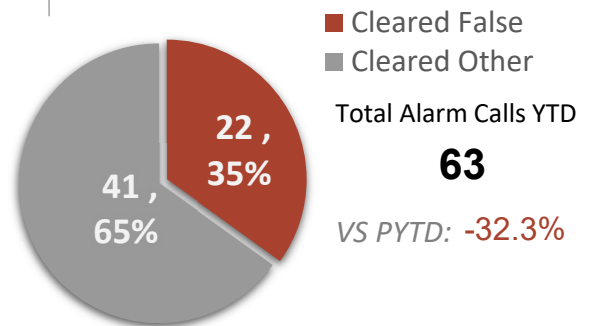

Crime Prevention Tips

— Unauthorized Entry in Motor Vehicle (UEMV) is among the most common crimes in Bend. The vast majority of vehicles are NOT locked and valuables are often left in plain sight, creating a crime of opportunity. Don't be a victim — remove packages, purses, wallets or other valuables from your vehicle and ALWAYS remember to lock up!

— Bend PD has worked hard to reduce the number of bike thefts by over 60% since 2015 and continues to work on this in daily. You can do your part to help by locking your bike with a quality lock and registering it at BikeIndex.org — it's FREE and easy!
